

First Nautical Safety Week says goodbye from Havana and Santiago de Cuba

More than thirty boats paraded this morning from the Morro Cabaña Historical Military Complex to the Torreón de la Chorrera to say goodbye to the First Nautical Safety Week that began last Monday, June 14, with about 100 crew members, including sailors, fishermen, Officers and

members of the Revolutionary War Navy, the Border Guard Troops of the Ministry of the Interior (MININT), the Ministries of Tourism and Transportation, INDER and the Hemingway International Nautical Club, set sail through the waters of the Malecón in Havana. Small and large maritime vessels, adorned with dozens of pennants and pennants.
